- 1. A leap year is a year that has 366 days; February has 29 days instead of the usual 28.
- 2. Leap years come every 4 years.
- 3. "It takes approximately 365.25 days for Earth to orbit the Sun a solar year. We usually round the days in a calendar year to 365. To make up for the missing partial day, we add one day to our calendar approximately every four years. That is a leap year," according to NASA. Read more at that site.
